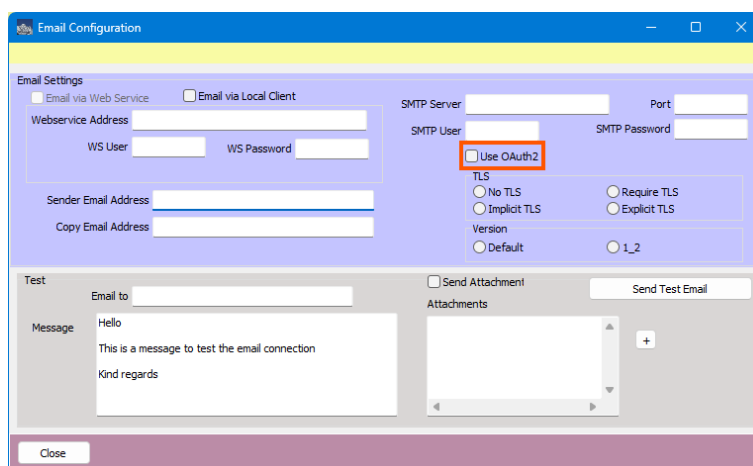

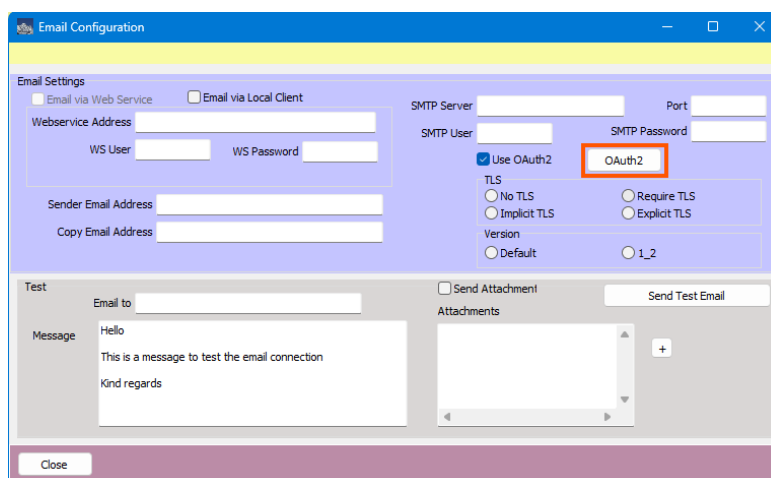
When setting up OAuth2 Access make sure the redirect URL is set to <http://localhost:8080/>.

Connecting OAuth2 to Annapurna

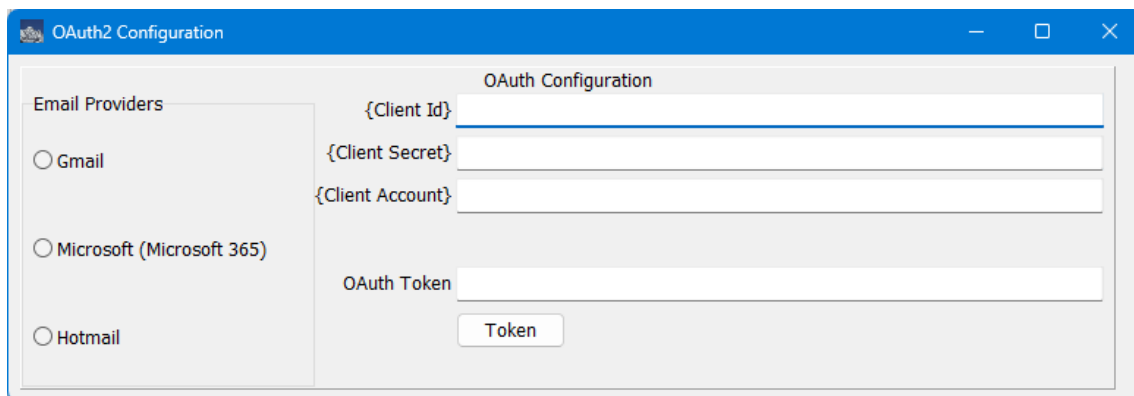
1. Navigate to the Email Configuration
2. Select 'Use OAuth2' checkbox



3. Select the [OAuth2] button



4. Select the Email Provider from the Left-Hand Side

5. Enter the relevant information from the Email provider

9. Close the OAuth2 Configuration screen
10. Send a test email to make sure the email sending is working
